Scholarships Alerts & Tips	<p><i>Application Tips</i></p> <p>There's a lot of advice out there about the best way to apply for scholarships -- how to "package" yourself in your essay, what extracurricular activities to emphasize, etc. The truth is, much of this advice can vary widely, depending on the author -- what works for one applicant may not necessarily work for another. You'll discover that most of the scholarship secrets you'll read about boil down to using your common sense and following directions carefully. Start Your Research Early: The more time you can put into your scholarship search, the more options you'll have. You'll need time to research scholarships, request information and application materials, and complete your application -- plus, some scholarships have deadlines early in the fall of senior year. Read Eligibility Requirements Carefully: The more time you can put into your scholarship search, the more options you'll have. If you have a question about your eligibility for a particular scholarship, contact the scholarship sponsors. Organize All Scholarship Materials: Create a separate file for each scholarship and file by application date. Keep a calendar of application deadlines and follow-up appointments. Many scholarships require you to provide them with some combination of the following: Transcript, Standardized test scores, Financial aid forms, such as the FAFSA or PROFILE ,Parent's financial information, including tax returns, One or more essays, One or more letters of</p>

recommendation and Proof of eligibility (e.g. membership credentials). You may also need to prepare for a personal interview. For students competing for talent-based scholarships, an audition, performance, or portfolio may be required. Proofread Your Application Carefully, use your computer's spelling and grammar check features. Have a parent, teacher, or friend read your essays, don't Leave Items Blank, contact scholarship sponsors if you aren't sure how to fill out any part of the application, and follow Instructions to the Letter

Private scholarships can actually reduce parts of your financial aid package, avoid going over the length limit for the essay, and resist the temptation to send supporting materials that are not requested in the application. Make Sure Your Application Is Legible: type or print your application forms and essays. Make Copies of Everything You Send: if application materials are lost, having copies on hand will make it much easier to resend your application quickly. Double-Check Your Application If you're reusing material (such as a cover letter or essay) from another scholarship application, be especially careful you haven't left in any incorrect names or blank fields. Don't forget to sign and date your application. Get Your Applications in early, or you'll miss out if you miss deadlines. Consider using certified mail or return receipt.

How Scholarships Affect Your Financial Aid Package:
private scholarships can actually reduce parts of your financial aid package. How? Colleges must consider outside scholarships as a student's financial resource, available to pay for education costs. If a college financial aid office meets your full financial need, government regulations specify that any scholarship money you win lowers your need figure on a dollar-for-dollar basis. What should matter to you is which types of your aid are reduced or eliminated -- self-help aid (loans or work-study) or need-based grants. Colleges, following federal regulations, can adjust your aid package in a variety of ways -- some will subtract the value of unmet need first, others will reduce self-help aid before reducing grants, still others will use scholarship funds only to replace grant money. Some schools even give you the option of using scholarships to reduce your expected family contribution. It's a good idea to contact the financial aid office of schools that interest you and inquire about their policies regarding outside scholarships

	<p>Before you begin writing, decide on your answer to the question asked of you. This is your basic thesis.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Before you begin writing, decide on what three pieces of evidence/support you will use to prove your thesis. 2. Write your introductory paragraph. Place your thesis along with your three pieces of evidence in order of strength (least to most) at the end of this paragraph. 3. Write the first paragraph of your body. You should begin by restating your thesis, focusing on the support of your first piece of evidence. 4. End your first paragraph with a transitional sentence that leads to paragraph number two. 5. Write paragraph two of the body focusing on your second piece of evidence. Once again make the connection between your thesis and this piece of evidence. 6. End your second paragraph with a transitional sentence that leads to paragraph number three. 7. Write paragraph three of the body focusing on your third piece of evidence. Again, make the connection between your thesis statement and this piece of evidence. 8. Begin your concluding paragraph by restating your thesis. Include the three points you have used to prove your thesis. 9. End your concluding paragraph with a statement of extension which will (hopefully) cause the reader to look beyond what you have written. You do not include new evidence in your last paragraph. <p>Tips: Never use I or you (unless specifically told that it is allowed). Do not use contractions in formal writing. Organization is one of the most important parts of good writing. Make sure to organize from the first paragraph on.</p>

Scholarships Alerts & Tips	<p>Scholarship Tips</p> <p>Five tips for getting the most out of a scholarship search. The time to start researching scholarships is now! There are all kinds of resources available. Check out the Web, your local library, college and university financial aid offices, civic organizations, and the places where you or your parents are employed or do volunteer work. Scholarships are available for students planning to enter college, already in college, or even in graduate school. High School students should start their scholarship search during sophomore year.</p> <p>Scholarships are available to students of all backgrounds, abilities, and levels. They are not limited to students with high academic averages, those entering college, or those who can demonstrate financial need. Scholarship committees, admissions recruiters and employers look favorably upon students who participate in extracurricular activities or do volunteer work. Group activities promote leadership qualities, communication skills, purpose and commitment. Most scholarship applications require a written personal statement discussing your background, accomplishments, and goals. This statement can set you apart from other applicants. Get started composing your personal statement now.</p>
Scholarships Alerts & Tips	<p>Top Ten Tips for Winning Scholarship Applications</p> <p>Apply only if you are eligible. Read all the scholarship requirements and directions carefully. Make sure you are eligible before you send in your application.</p> <p>Complete the application in full. If a question does not apply to you, note that on the application. Do not leave a question blank. Be sure to supply all additional supporting materials, including transcripts, letters of recommendation, and essays.</p> <p>Follow directions. Provide everything that is required. However, do not supply things that are not requested--you could be disqualified.</p> <p>Neatness counts. Always type your application, or if you must print do so neatly and legibly. Make a couple of photocopies of all the forms before you fill them out. Use</p>

	<p>the copies as working drafts as you develop your application packet.</p> <p>Write an essay that makes a strong impression. The key to writing a strong essay is to be personal and specific. Include concrete details to make your experience come alive: who, what, where, and when of your topic. The simplest experience can be monumental if you honestly present how you were affected.</p> <p>Watch all deadlines. To help keep yourself on track, impose your own deadline that is at least two weeks prior to the official deadline. Use the buffer time to make sure everything is ready on time. Do not rely on extensions--very few scholarship providers allow them at all.</p> <p>Make sure your application gets where it needs to go. Put your name (and Social Security number, if applicable) on all pages of the application. Pieces of your application may get lost unless they are clearly identified.</p> <p>Keep a back-up file in case anything goes wrong. Before sending the application, make a copy of the entire packet. If your application goes astray, you will be able to reproduce it quickly.</p> <p>Give it a final 'once-over.' Proofread the entire application carefully. Be on the lookout for misspelled words or grammatical errors. Ask a friend, teacher, or parent to proofread it as well.</p> <p>Ask for help if you need it. If you have problems with the application, do not hesitate to call the funding organization.</p> <p>It is also important to make sure your letters of recommendation are addressed to the organization whose scholarship you are applying for and that they are current.</p>

Scholarships College Preparation	PSAT Information on the Score Report: The PSAT/ NMSQT score reports provide three different scores on the 20-to-80 scale. One each for verbal skills, math skills, and writing skills. The average verbal, math, and writing skills score for juniors is about 49. Also on your score report is the Selection Index, which is the sum of the three scores (V + M + W). The Selection Index ranges from 60 to 240. The average Selection Index of juniors is about 147. Score reports include percentiles, which allow you to compare your scores with those of other juniors who will be applying to college. For example, a student with a percentile of 53 has earned a score better than 53 out of every 100 college bound juniors who took the test. Go to the Truth

For more information, go to Scholarship and Recognition Programs</p> <p>Converting the PSAT/ NMSQT Score to a Comparable SAT Score Converting a PSAT/ NMSQT score to a comparable SAT score is easy. The PSAT/ NMSQT are on a scale of 20 to 80. SAT tests are on a scale of 200 to 800. Simply add a zero to your PSAT/ NMSQT score to convert it to a corresponding SAT score. For example, a PSAT/NMSQT score of 56 is similar to an SAT score of 560. Your score report will also provide estimates for SAT scores based on your PSAT/ NMSQT results.</p>
